

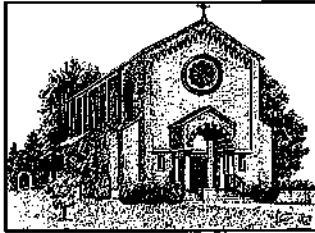

## FROM OUR PASTOR, FATHER AMATO

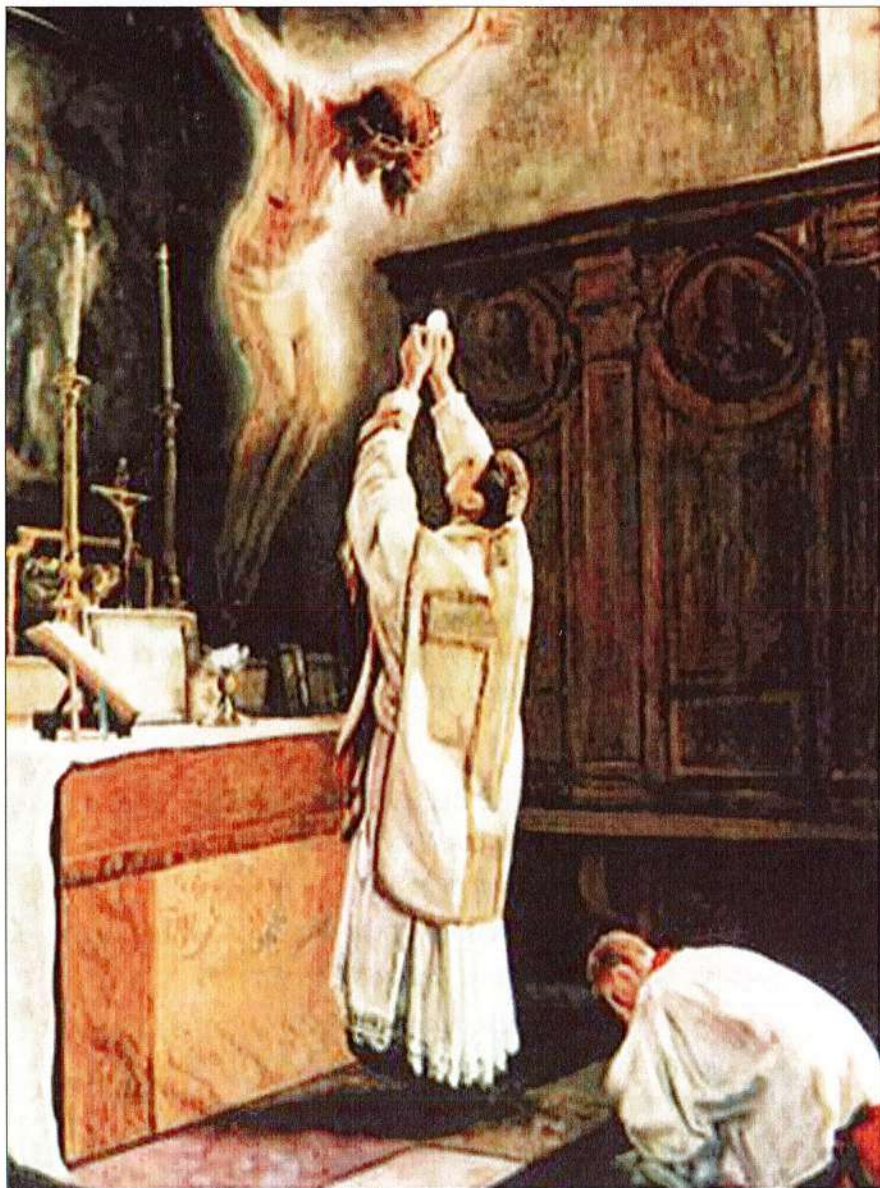
As we settle into the new calendar year and enter again into Ordinary Time until Lent, I want to revisit my series of articles on the Roman Canon (Eucharistic Prayer I). It was already over two years ago that I wrote those articles, but while we hear it over and over again, and maybe even read along in the missal, it is important to delve deeper into the words we pray for a greater understanding of what is happening.

First, however, I want to give an overview of the Mass and our participation. I feel it is common today to think that it is "easier" to participate at Mass because the priest says everything out loud, so that almost every word is heard, and he is speaking English. But are we actually entering into the reality of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass more effectively? Whether the priest is standing at the back of the altar so that the people can see his face, or he is facing in the same direction as the people, as their head ("toward the Lord"; "liturgical East"; "*ad orientem*"), everyone still has to do the hard work of participating at Mass in the way proper to their state of life.

We come to Mass prepared to pray. I know it can be difficult to get out of the house and to the church on time, with so many things going on and varying distractions. We come in all humility and trust, seeking union with our God who desires to draw us to Himself. Throughout the Mass we are drawn by the various prayers to approach our God through adoration, thanksgiving, petition, and satisfaction. Remember, as I have written previously, these are the four "ends," or purposes of Mass (and prayer in general), and so we take on these dispositions at various points during the Mass.

At the beginning of Mass, the priest and servers approach the sanctuary, the priest ascends the steps of the altar to venerate it with a kiss, and then we humble ourselves in a spirit of penitence and contrition. The entire first part of the Mass, the Penitential Rite and the Liturgy of the Word, is meant to prepare us to approach the Holy of Holies, the presence of God, to offer this perfect Sacrifice. Therefore, we truly must "confess" our sinfulness and acknowledge our unworthiness before our Father, and even

one another: "I confess to Almighty God, and to you, my brothers and sisters...." With that act, we are ready to praise God and so our hearts turn to adoration and gratitude ("Glory to God in the Highest...") and then to supplication and petition (the opening Collect). All of that is in the first ten minutes of Mass!



We then hear the readings, which all speak of Christ in some way. While the homily/sermon attempts to "unpack" the Scriptures and teach on some aspect of faith and morals, the Creed then follows as a summary of all that we believe. At this point we are prepared to see the one whom we heard about in the Scriptures, now come to us on the altar. I will go through the prayers of the Canon in the following weeks, but what we will see is that, while there are definite times when vocal participation/ response is important, it is the interior dispositions (thoughts, attitudes, etc.) that ultimately define our participation. Otherwise, our vocal responses will be empty.

The "Our Father" begins our preparation for Communion, as we repeat the words that Jesus Himself gave us. We again publicly profess our unworthiness to receive the Lamb of God ("Lord I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof..."), and then consume the Divine Victim who was offered at the hands of the priest. Finally, we thank God at the Post-Communion Prayer, receive the blessing, and are then sent back into the world to share the Good News, filled with God's grace and Life.
