





FROM OUR PASTOR, FATHER AMATO

As we enter into this prayer, we must realize its antiquity and its importance for the history of Christendom, wherever the Roman Catholic Church had spread. The words that you hear me pray every week seemed to have remained exactly the same since Pope St. Gregory the Great (AD 590-604; St. Joseph's name was added to the list of saints in 1962). Many of the prayers of the Roman Canon were already set for centuries before St. Gregory. And so, when we pray these words, we pray as every Roman Catholic priest had prayed on all those altars all over Europe and throughout the mission lands for centuries upon centuries. We have inherited this beautiful prayer and Tradition.

The word "canon" comes from a Greek word which simply means "rule." It is the rule of our prayer; it regulates how we offer the Mass. And what exactly are we doing when we "offer the Mass?" The bread and the wine are the necessary matter for this offering, but the essence of the Mass is the "true and real Sacrifice" (as the Council of Trent teaches) of the Son of God to the Father.

But how are we sacrificing Jesus if He already reigns at the right hand of the Father? The Holy Sacrifice of the Mass is both a re-presentation of Jesus' own offering of Himself on the Cross, and it is a new act of sacrifice, a true immolation of the Divine Victim on the altar. As an act of sacrifice this is accomplished through the double consecration of the bread and wine into Christ's Body and Blood. His Blood is shed in an unbloody, sacramental manner. The Victim is then offered to the Father as a perfect sacrifice. The Mass re-presents – makes present to us – the Sacrifice of the Cross through these sacramental signs and so we participate in the eternal worship of God in Heaven. Christ died once and so merited for us an infinite treasury of graces. At every Mass, through this act of sacrifice, those graces are applied to us according to God's will and our dispositions.

With these things in mind, we can turn to each of the prayers of the Roman Canon to see its purpose in this perfect act of worship.

The Roman Canon has three sections to the prayer before the consecration. Notice how it begins with "therefore":

"To you, therefore, most merciful Father, we make humble prayer and petition through Jesus Christ, your Son, our Lord: that you accept and bless + these gifts, these offerings, these holy and unblemished sacrifices, which we offer you firstly for your holy catholic Church.

Be pleased to grant her peace, to guard, unite and govern her throughout the whole world, together with your servant N. our Pope and N. our Bishop, and all those who, holding to the truth, hand on the catholic and apostolic faith."


What is being said there at the beginning of the prayer is that we have presented our gifts of bread and wine, we have sung the praises of God (Holy, Holy, Holy) and given him thanks and adoration (Preface), now we are in a position to "make humble prayer and petition" to the Father, through Jesus Christ.

We will see throughout these prayers how the four purposes for which we offer the Mass are constantly present. The four purposes or "ends" of Mass are: adoration of God; thanksgiving for graces and favors we have obtained; propitiation and satisfaction of sins; and petition. We begin by asking God to bless these gifts we present to Him so that they can be ready to be consecrated so that sanctifying grace may be given to us through them, as they will become the Body and Blood of Christ.

The entire Eucharistic Prayer is addressed to God the Father. This is important to realize when we see the priest at the altar. He is not addressing the people at this point. He is praying and offering a sacrifice on their behalf. And so, the priest approaches the Father and offers these gifts "firstly for your holy catholic Church," that is, all of the baptized throughout the whole world. These are the "first fruits" of the Mass since the Mass is the prayer of the whole Church.

We specifically ask for four blessings: that God Himself grant peace to the Church, that He guard, unite, and govern her. We ask for these things because we know they are in danger of being lost. History shows this quite clearly. We are not praying for some abstract Church, but for the actual community of believers living right now under the Pope (universally) and the bishop named (locally). Since the Church is not only a Mystical Body, but also a visible Body, we pray for all the leaders of the Church, and, indeed all true believers, who according to their state in life, will faithfully propagate the Faith throughout the earth.


