






FROM OUR PASTOR, FATHER AMATO

In this third installment of our reflection upon the Roman Canon, we look at the second section to the prayer before the consecration. The priest now asks the Father to keep close to Himself all those who are present:

"Remember, Lord, your servants N. and N. and all gathered here, whose faith and devotion are known to you. For them, we offer you this sacrifice of praise or they offer it for themselves and all who are dear to them, for the redemption of their souls, in hope of health and well-being, and paying their homage to you, the eternal God, living and true."

It is important to point out again that the Eucharistic Prayer is addressed to the Father and on behalf of the people. The priest does not speak to the people during the Mass except in the few times when he addresses them with, "The Lord be with you," or during the readings and the homily. The vast majority of the time, he stands as a mediator (in the person of Christ) between the people and God, to bring to God their prayers and sacrifices, and to bring to the people God's grace and blessings.

It may, at times, be difficult to see this reality because the priest often faces the people while standing at the altar. This can easily give the impression that the priest is speaking to the people, or at least, that the Eucharistic Prayer is a kind of monologue, where the people patiently sit and listen. In reality, the priest stands as head of the people, *leading them in prayer to the Father*. There is a sort of motion happening where the people of God, gathered by Christ, venture to our heavenly homeland – even if just for those few precious moments during the Mass. This is why the priest and people facing the *same direction* – a common direction such that the priest is leading them, and so they see his back – was the usual way a priest would say Mass until relatively recently. I would say that it allows the people to participate *more fully* in the Mass because they are not given the impression that they are just waiting for the priest to say something to which they must respond. Rather, they are invited to venture with the priest into the presence of God, following Him by the Eucharistic Prayer, and making those words their own.

As for the prayer we look at today, you will notice at Mass that I make a long pause after the words, "Remember, Lord, your servants." This prayer is called the "Memento of the Living." At that moment when I pause, I am praying for all those who I have in mind who have asked me for their prayers and others whom I know need prayers. When I pause, this

is also your opportunity to mention silently to God all those for whom you wish to pray at this Mass. This is part of your active participation. And so, I pray not just for my own needs and intentions, but as the priest who is offering this particular Sacrifice of the Mass, I am asking God, on your behalf, to send down His graces for those intentions as well.

Then we pray for three specific intentions that are mentioned here at every Mass. I had written previously that the Mass is offered for four purposes or "ends": adoration, thanksgiving, propitiation, petition. Here in this prayer, we are praying "for the redemption of their souls." It is a sacrifice of atonement or propitiation. We also pray "in hope of health and well-being." It is a sacrifice of petition.

Finally, we pay our homage and adoration to the eternal God through this sacrifice, at each and every Mass. What this part of the prayer is saying is that not only do we offer these gifts of bread and wine, which will become the Divine Victim who the priest (and the people with him) offer to the Father, but we also offer ourselves, our whole lives. We offer all our prayers, our labors and sufferings, our joys and trials. All of it is being prepared to be lifted up to the sight of the Father at this moment. We have nothing that God did not already give us. At the Mass, we offer it all back to the Living and True God.






