

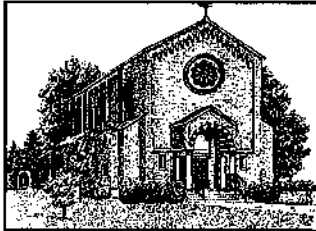

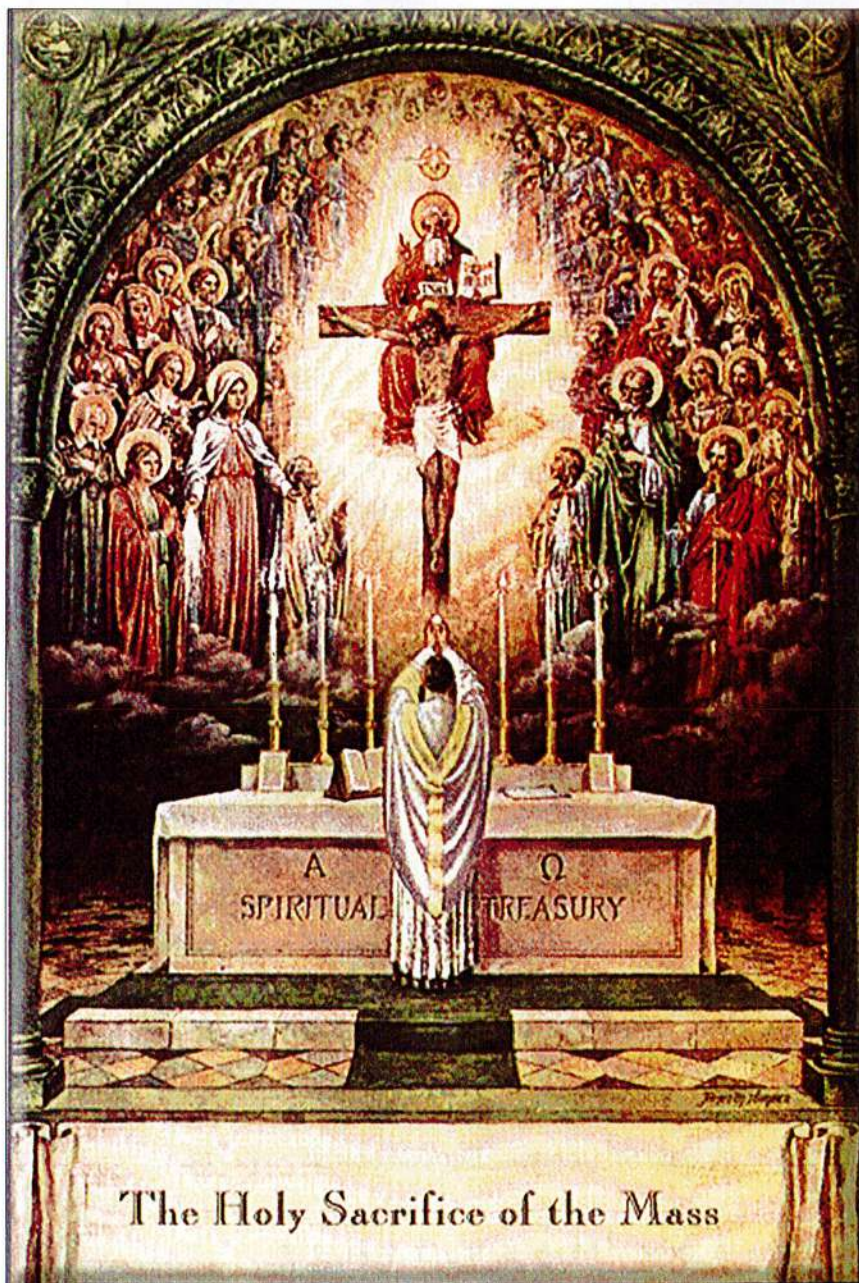
FROM OUR PASTOR, FATHER AMATO

We have entered the center and heart of the Eucharistic Prayer, where God comes to us on our altar. Now, we turn to the second half of the Canon, where we see three parts of a prayer, where we ask God to accept the Divine Victim now on our altar:

Therefore, O Lord, as we celebrate the memorial of the blessed Passion, the Resurrection from the dead, and the glorious Ascension into heaven of Christ, your Son, our Lord, we, your servants and your holy people, offer to your glorious majesty from the gifts that you have given us, this pure victim, this holy victim, this spotless victim, the holy Bread of eternal life and the Chalice of everlasting salvation.

What is happening here? There is no longer bread and wine on the altar. Only the appearances remain. As I look down at the corporal on the altar, I am just a few inches away from the face of God, the Eucharistic Face of Jesus.

This part of the Canon is called the Anamnesis. This is a Greek word meaning "a remembrance" or "reminiscing." Here the Church, through the priest, recalls what Christ has done to bring about our Redemption. Again we have the word, "Therefore," which looks back to the Consecration. The last words of the Consecration were, "Do this in memory of me." And so, in fulfilling the Lord's command, we begin the second part of the Canon by calling to mind the Paschal Mystery, the Lord's Death, Resurrection, and Ascension into heaven. This "remembering" will continue throughout the next parts of the prayer. In this prayer of the Canon, we have something that goes back probably to Apostolic times. It is one of the oldest prayers we have, and so it is precious to us.



We should, as well, notice the subject of the offering: "your servants and your holy people." The first subjects (the one who is offering) are priests at the altar, and the next subject is everyone else praying with them. Of course, the people are servants of God too, but here it is more specifically referencing those who serve at the altar, serving God directly by administering the Sacraments. The "holy people" of God are those who are "holy" because they have been sanctified in Baptism, incorporated into the Mystical Body of Christ, and now offer this sacrifice, in their capacity, with the priest. "Holy" means those who are set apart from the world and belong to God.

The final part of this prayer makes the first reference to Holy Communion in the Canon. We have nothing that we did not first receive from God: our creation, our redemption, and even the bread and wine we have offered. "The gifts that you have given us" makes us realize that even the things we have to offer God were first His gifts anyways. Therefore, everything we have and are must be given back to Him. And here, at the Mass, He gives us Himself and so we offer this "pure Victim, this holy Victim, this spotless Victim" back to the Eternal Father, offering God to God. It is then that His most bountiful mercy pours out upon us, for all those needs for which we prayed in the first half of the Canon.

THE SEASON OF LENT BEGINS NEXT WEEK, ASH WEDNESDAY, MARCH 5TH

Traditionally, the Lenten season is a time of penance, prayer, the reception of the sacraments, charity and almsgiving. The following are various Lenten regulations:

Good Friday—along with Ash Wednesday, this is a day of fast & abstinence from meat. Everyone between the ages of 18 & 59 inclusive are limited to one full meal on this day.

All Fridays of Lent—Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence from meat. All those 14 & up are bound to abstain from meat.

Other Weekdays of Lent—There is no obligation to fast. However, voluntary acts of self-denial are recommended (like giving up something difficult.)
