FROM OUR PASTOR, FATHER AMATO

I want to pick up where we left off last week. There, I discussed the concepts of satisfaction for sin and of the Communion of Saints. Now we are in a better position to understand that in this mystical bond that binds us together as brothers and sisters in the Body of Christ, there is an exchange of goods that we all share. This is the "treasury of the Church." We understand the "treasury of the Church" to be "the infinite and inexhaustible value the expiation and the merits of Christ Our Lord have before God, offered as they were so that all of mankind could be set free from sin and attain communion with the Father. It is Christ the Redeemer himself in whom the satisfactions and merits of his redemption exist and find their force" (*Indulgentiarum Doctrina*, 5). This "treasury" also includes the merits of all the saints, especially those of the Blessed Virgin Mary, who now reign in heaven with Christ, and whose bond with us is strengthened by the fact that they are now forever united to Christ in glory.

As the Church is not just a Mystical Body, but also truly a visible Body, governed by the Pope (and the bishops in communion with him), the Lord gave this authority to Peter, the Apostles, and their successors. Part of this authority to govern, teach, and sanctify, is to dispense the treasury of merits for the benefit of individual faithful. Therefore, an "indulgence" is: "the remission before God of the temporal punishment due sins already forgiven as far as their guilt is concerned, which the follower of Christ with the proper dispositions and under certain determined conditions acquires through the intervention of the Church which, as minister of the Redemption, authoritatively dispenses and applies the treasury of the satisfaction won by Christ and the saints" (*ID*, n. 1).

In this definition we can see the various states of the Church, all part of the living Body of Christ. The Church Triumphant is composed of all those who have attained eternal life in heaven. They now live forever to worship God and to intercede on behalf of the rest of the Church. We are the Church Militant, still striving in this world through the battle of earthly life. The Church Suffering is the Church in Purgatory. Those in Purgatory are destined for eternal glory but have yet to make adequate satisfaction for all their (previously confessed and forgiven) sins. Since we are all part of this same Body of Christ (whether on earth, heaven, or purgatory), we can assist each other on our journey to heaven. One way to do that is through what we call indulgences. We are already very familiar with assisting each other, even after death, with prayer and having Masses said. Indulgences are a very specific form of prayer, with other practices attached to it at times, that have a particular purpose.



There are *partial* and *plenary* indulgences. Partial indulgences remit some of the punishments due to sin while plenary indulgences remit all punishments. We can earn partial indulgences through various means. For example, if we are undergoing some particular suffering, or we are fasting, we can make the intention to offer that suffering for a partial indulgence. There are also many indulgenced prayers, such as the Acts of Faith, Hope, and Charity.

In order to earn a plenary indulgence, one must perform the particular work to which the indulgence is attached (for example, a half-hour of Eucharistic Adoration), sacramental confession (within 20 days before or after the work), receive Holy Communion (typically on the day the indulgenced work is performed), and pray for the intentions of the Supreme Pontiff (typically one Our Father, one Hail Mary, and one Glory Be). It is further required that all attachment to sin, even to venial sin, be absent. If this last condition is not met, the indulgence will be partial.

I give all this information to you at this time, not just because it is important to know, but because next week we celebrate All Saints and All Souls Days. The Church is generous towards those who are in Purgatory, as one of the Spiritual Works of Mercy is to pray for the dead. During that week we have a special opportunity to assist the dead so that they may at last attain their eternal reward.

Next week I will give more specifics on obtaining the plenary indulgences for the dead, as well as both partial and plenary indulgences for ourselves.


