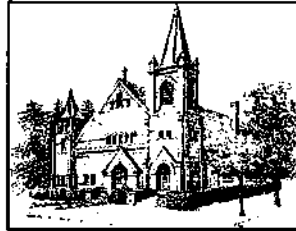

FROM OUR PASTOR, FATHER AMATO

Happy Mothers' Day to all our wonderful mothers! Enjoy this day where we honor you for all your great love, devotion, and sacrifices. Thank you for all you do.

Also, congratulations to all our First Communicants last week! It was a glorious Mass, always special and unique in our calendar, where so much joy is present as our children receive our Eucharistic Lord for the first time. That Mass is one I look forward to and is one of my greatest privileges as a priest.

Last week, in preparation for our *Corpus Christi* celebration and parish picnic on June 2, I reproduced an article here about the history and purpose of liturgical processions. Throughout the history of the Church, we had processions for every need for which we should ask God for help. The procession on *Corpus Christi* was probably the latest development in our practice and devotion of liturgical processions, dating from around the early 14th century. But it was not universal by that date.

As devotion to the Most Blessed Sacrament grew throughout those years, public worship also grew into processions through the streets and towns across Europe. Once we arrived at the 16th century, the beginnings of the Protestant Reformation were taking hold and one of their criticisms was our adoration of the Most Holy Eucharist, the Church, of course, had to respond. The Council of Trent was called to deal with this new crisis. There have only been about 21 Ecumenical Councils in the history of the Church. After the Council of Trent, there was Vatican I (1870) and then Vatican II (1962-65). They are relatively rare.

The Council of Trent dealt specifically with our faith in the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist and even with Eucharistic Processions:

“The holy Synod declares, moreover, that very piously and religiously was this custom introduced into the Church, that this sublime and venerable sacrament be, with special veneration and solemnity, celebrated, every year, on a certain day, and that a festival; and that it be borne reverently and with honour in processions through the streets, and public places. For it is most just that there be certain appointed holy days, whereon all Christians may, with a special and unusual demonstration, testify that their minds are grateful and thankful to their common Lord and Redeemer for so ineffable and truly divine a benefit, whereby the victory and triumph of His death are represented. And so indeed did it behove victorious truth to celebrate a triumph over falsehood and heresy, that thus her adversaries, at the sight of so much splendour, and in the midst of so great joy of the universal Church, may either pine away weakened and broken; or, touched with shame and confounded, at length repent.” [Council of Trent, Session XIII, October 11, 1551]

We have the joy to know our true Risen Lord in the Most Holy Eucharist, and the privilege to bring Him to all people. Everyone is looking for their God. Everyone wants a Redeemer. We know Him and love Him. I will close, as I often do, with the beautiful words from Dom Prosper Guéranger:

“By this most perfect of bodies, by this sacred Flesh, the ineffable mystery of the marriage between man and eternal Wisdom is every day continued in the Eucharistic banquet. For our true Solomon, then, each day is the day of the joy of His heart, the day of nuptial rejoicing. Could anything be more just than that, once in the year, holy Church should give full freedom to the transports of her love for her divine Spouse, who resides with her in the Sacrament of love, although in a hidden manner?”

It is on this account that, in today's Mass, the priest has consecrated two Hosts...[one of which] is to be carried in [the priest's] trembling hands, beneath a canopy, while hymns of triumphant joy are being sung, and the faithful, in prostrate adoration, are being blessed by Jesus, who thus comes amongst them.”
